



## Advanced Extrication Scenarios

**Pre-requisite for admission:** Hydraulic rescue tool training, pneumatic air bag training and some experience with stabilizing struts and proper stabilizing/shoring procedures.

**Class Schedule:** The day will be broken into 30 minutes of introductory classroom time, three 2 ½ hour hands-on advanced extrication scenarios and will finish with another 30 minutes of closing discussion and course evaluations.

**Extrication Scenarios:** The student will be exposed to 3 separate extrication situations throughout the course of the day. Each scenario will last approximately 2 ½ hours, with 2 separate extrication events taking place at each station (75 minutes each). Your company will be expected to safely and efficiently rescue the trapped occupant/occupants within the "GOLDEN HOUR"

**Vehicle into the water:** Your company is dispatched to a report of a vehicle off the road into a river, upside down with confirmed entrapment. The river is approximately 24-30 inches deep with moving water and the victim is not visible at the time of arrival.

**Highway entrapment involving a jersey barrier:** Your company is dispatched to a report of a multiple vehicle accident on I-95, with a multi car accident and confirmed entrapment with a vehicle on its side into the barrier.

**Highway entrapment involving a vehicle under a tractor trailer:** Your company is dispatched to a report of a motor vehicle accident on I-95 involving a vehicle reported to be under the rear of a tractor trailer with confirmed entrapment.

**Vendors Attending this event:** Firematic Supply, Shipmans Fire Equipment, Paratech, Hurst, Holmatro, Rescue Jack, Rescue 42 and a few others. This will give the student the ability to use new equipment on the market that can be applied to each of the scenarios.

## Trench

Statistics show that nearly 100 people die and thousands more are injured in trench related accidents every year. This 3-day program will give students the knowledge they need to stay safe while operating at a trench incident. This course will focus on size-up and scene management, hazard identification and control, soil analysis, collapse patterns, sheeting and shoring, patient extrication, as well as the NFPA standards and OSHA regulations governing trench and excavation. Safety will be emphasized throughout this entire program. In order to prepare the students for an actual incident, "hands-on" training will take place inside the Fairfield Regional Fire School's new "trench simulator".

## Confined Space Rescue

This course will train students to perform confined space rescue operations. The training objectives meet NFPA 1006 and OSHA 1910.146. Students will learn to preplan, evaluate atmospheres and use protective equipment related to confined spaces, implement and terminate an incident management system for confined space. Students will exercise their previous knowledge for victim management and rope rescue techniques to remove a victim from a confined space.
